Now, I would like to present the key activities and initiatives carried out by Lions International, District 325D during the period from February 15, 2025, to June 27, 2025, along with other notable events and engagements that contributed to the continued progress and impact of our district during the final quarter of this Lionistic year.

1. Third Regular District Cabinet Meeting:

The Third Regular District Cabinet Meeting was successfully conducted on February 15, 2025, at Chhimeki Party Palace, Jorpati, Kathmandu, Nepal. The meeting was honored by the presence of GAT Area Leader Lion Khagendra Sitaula, LCIF Area Leader Lion Rajan Lamsal, IPDG/MCC Lion Ramesh Kumar Lama, and Multiple Council Treasurer / District Governor of District 325F, Lion Shankar Prasad Sarada, along with other distinguished leaders including Multiple District Pediatric Cancer Coordinator PMCC Lion Sunil Bhakta Shrestha, Multiple District GLT Coordinator Lion Uttam Prasad Jha, Multiple District GMT Coordinator Lion Manishree Ratna Bajracharya, First Vice District Governor Lion Mahesh Acharya, Second Vice District Governor Lion Yog Raj Kandel Sharma, Multiple Council Member Lion Lila Kumar Dhungel, Multiple District Vision Chairperson PDG Lion Kumar Raj Subedi, PMCC Lion Biswo Ram Gorkhali, PDG Lion Bishnu Bhai Shrestha, Cabinet Treasurer Lion Mandar Shikhar Bandyopadhyaya, Chief District Advisor Lion Deepak Kumar Bhandari, Cabinet Officers, Club Officers, Lions, Leo District President, Leo District Vice President, Leos, and guests.

During the meeting, several important resolutions and proposals were endorsed, and it was decided to forward them to LCIF and Multiple District 325 for approval.

The meeting was jointly hosted by Lions Club of Kathmandu Basuki, Lions Club of Kathmandu Gokarneshwor, Lions Club of Kathmandu Infinity, Lions Club of Kathmandu Sharing Hearts, and Lions Club of Kathmandu Sukunda.

2. Third Annual District Convention:

The Third Annual District Convention of Lions Clubs International, District 325D, Nepal was held at Anupam Foodland, Battisputali, Kathmandu on Saturday, March 29, 2025. The convention was presided over by District Governor Lion Surendra Prakash Balay, PMJF.

The convention was hosted by Lions Club of Kathmandu Jorpati, LCK Danfe, LCK Melvin Jones, and co-hosted by Lions Club of Dingla Bhojpur, LC Kathmandu, LCK Akarshan, LCK Gokarneshwor, LCK Indrasarowor, LCK Kapan, LCK Manahara, LCK Skill Development, LCK Sukunda, and LC Sankhu.



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The event was honored by the presence of Chief Guest Honorable Santosh Chalise, Member of the Federal Parliament, along with PID Lion Sanjaya Khetan, GAT Area Leader Lion Khagendra Sitaula, LCIF Area Leader Lion Rajan Lamsal, MCC Lion Ramesh Kumar Lama, District Governors, Multiple Council Coordinators, Vice District Governors, Multiple District Chairpersons, Past Council Chairpersons, Past District Governors, Cabinet Secretaries, Cabinet Treasurers, Cabinet Officers, Club Officers, Lions, and Leos.

Various committees presented their reports during the convention. The resolutions proposed by the committees were passed and endorsed, and the approved proposals were forwarded to Multiple District 325 for further consideration.

From the convention, the following leaders were elected for LY 2025-2026:

- District Governor: Lion Mahesh Acharya (Vice District Governor)
- First Vice District Governor: Lion Yog Raj Kandel Sharma (Second Vice District Governor)
- Second Vice District Governor: Lion Dharma Sharan Shrestha (GST District Coordinator)

Similarly, Lion Khagendra Sitaula, the current GAT Leader and candidate for International Director Endorsee for LY 2026-2027, was unanimously endorsed by the district convention.

3. Annual Multiple District Convention 2025

The Annual Multiple District Convention of Multiple District 325, Nepal, was held at The Nepal Academy, Kamaladi, Kathmandu, on Saturday, June 7, 2025. The convention witnessed participation from over 2,000 attendees, marking the highest attendance in the history of Multiple District 325 conventions.

Some key resolutions were passed during the convention, including:

- Granting voting rights to Past District Governors (PDGs)
- Formation of a Finance Committee to monitor the financial activities of the Multiple District

However, proposals related to the increment of membership fees, specifically Rs. 100 for Marketing and Branding and Rs. 100 for the Multiple District Building Fund, were rejected.



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The convention also elected the leadership of Multiple District 325 for Lions Year 2025–2026:

- Council Chairperson: Lion Milan Thapa
- Council Vice Chairperson: Lion Vidhan Joshi
- Council Secretary: Lion Babarjung Thapa
- Council Treasurer: Lion Nawaraj Sapkota

In addition, the convention elected the International Director Endorsee for Lions Year 2026–2027. Lion Rajan Lamsal, the current LCIF Area Leader, was elected as the International Director Endorsee from Multiple District 325.

4. Past District Governors (PDG) Meeting

On March 27, 2025, District Governor Lion Surendra Prakash Balay convened a Past District Governors (PDG) Meeting at Nepal House Restaurant, Hattisar, Kathmandu. The meeting focused on key district matters, including the upcoming Third Annual District Convention, the election of district governors, preparations for the election campaign of the district's candidate for International Director Endorsee, and the election process for the ID Endorsee at the upcoming Multiple District Convention. It served as a valuable platform for experienced leaders to share insights and offer guidance, particularly regarding leadership development and the election of the Second Vice District Governor for LY 2025-2026.

5. Cabinet Officers' Schooling Program

The Cabinet Officers' Schooling Program for the Lions Year 2025–2026 was held at The Lakeside Retreat, Pokhara, from May 16 to 17, 2025 (Jestha 2 to 3, 2082). This two day residential program was organized by the District Governor Elect. Lion Mahesh Acharya for the incoming cabinet members. The purpose of the program was to prepare and guide the leadership team with the knowledge, roles, and plans needed for the upcoming Lionistic year. More than 160 participants took part in the program, making it a successful and motivating event for everyone involved.

6. Regular Meetings

Several important meetings were held from February 15, 2025, to June 27, 2025, to ensure smooth coordination and effective execution of district activities. DG Team Meetings and DG Team–GAT Team Joint Meetings were organized as needed. These meetings played a vital role in the preparations for the Third Annual District Convention, the Multiple District Convention, and in reviewing district targets, monitoring ongoing projects, addressing challenges, and strategizing future initiatives for the overall development of the district.
